# MEETING OVERVIEW

---

Along with plenary speakers and interest group sessions, the conference includes a Thursday evening reception, working-lunch meetings, a Society business meeting, a women's caucus breakfast, a student caucus luncheon, and a banquet. During the conference, attendees will have opportunities to socialize, become acquainted with other SPS participants, and share their scholarly interests and current work. Attendees will also enjoy discounted prices on a variety of books and other products exhibited by vendors and ministries.

## THEME

The 2022 conference theme explores the ways in which new theories and methodologies support the advancements in Pentecostal inquiry. Important strides have been made in the scholarly understanding of Pentecostal and Charismatic Christianity. However, a reticence remains in appropriating innovative theories and methods that offer a potentially more vigorous understanding of Pentecostalism, its theological and social concerns, its rituals and practices, and what the study of Pentecostalism contributes to these approaches. What advancements promote the development of Pentecostal and Charismatic scholarship? What theoretical trends could assist Pentecostal inquiry? What are the future possibilities for thinking about the experience and activity of the Spirit of God in the world? These are fruitful questions for consideration.

Papers are invited from all disciplinary fields that explore new theories and methods that expand our understanding of Pentecostal and Charismatic Christianity and its theological, social, cultural, and political concerns. Parallel sessions are invited to explore the relationship of Pentecostalism and theories such as postmodernism, deconstructionism, poststructuralism, postcolonialism, postemotionalism, and posthumanism. We welcome the exploration of constructivist and narrative approaches as they support the production of imaginaries, and the concerns of theological construction as it attempts to contextualize the understanding of revelation. Also of interest are papers exploring Pentecostal appropriations of critical theory, race theory, intersectionality, feminist, womanist, and other critical approaches, as well as investigations of the relationship between Pentecostalism and existentialism, phenomenology, embodiment, or other theoretical frameworks.

## PLENARY SPEAKERS



### **“The African American Pentecostal Preacher as Public Theologian: Pentecostal Power in Social Justice”**

Antipas Harris | Jakes Divinity School

Thursday, March 24th at 7:00pm

---

This lecture reveals how 20th and early 21st Century black Pentecostal preachers participated in the struggle for social justice and black liberation when white members of the North American Pentecostal movement conceded to an era of Jim Crow’s racism. This lecture presents snapshots of six black Pentecostal pastors: Laura Adorkor Kofi, Ida B. Robinson, Robert Clarence Lawson, Arthur M. Brazier, Herbert Daughtry, and Thomas Dexter Jakes. It reconsiders their ministry leadership approaches as source-models for African American Pentecostal public theology. These leaders are models on two crucial fronts: 1) they function as historical authority within the broad contours of the black Pentecostal tradition, and 2) they exemplify innovative hermeneutics that point toward new approaches for engaging public affairs and serving common good. In contemporary discussions about public liberation theology, black Pentecostal pastors have not been viewed as authoritative sources in the conversation. This lecture addresses the source-gap for contemporary black Pentecostal public theologians whose work aims to be faithful to Pentecostal spiritual and theological distinctions, while advancing a progressive view of human liberation.

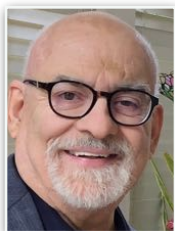


## “Emergent Diseases in a Globalized World: The Viral Nature of Racism”

Loida Martell | Lexington Theological Seminary  
Friday, March 25th at 10:45am

---

In March of 2020, the World Health Organization declared a global pandemic caused by a new emergent viral infectious agent that popularly came to be known as COVID-19. The United States then declared that the country was under a medical emergency. During that same period, the country, convulsed with the deaths of George Floyd, Ahmaud Arbery, and Breonna Taylor, and a wave of anti-Asian violence, realized it was facing a second pandemic of racism. This presentation will discuss the links between emergent viral diseases (defined as new or resurgent diseases arising in the past two decade), climate change, and globalization. It will further note that the same patterns of exploitation and indifference to created life that contribute to emergent diseases are the ones that have contributed to the anti-Asian violence, racial violence, and health disparities among communities of color. The presentation will close with a theological response by suggesting that the biblical notion of sabbath rooted in Creation, and specifically that of Jubilee, provides a framework, a soteriological “vaccine.” Specifically, the mandate of Jubilee calls upon God’s people to allow the land to rest, to restore and redistribute wealth, and to liberate (*deror*) the enslaved. Such a call permits the moving of the Spirit, to breathe and to re-create, renewing the land and re-forming the broken relationships between God and humankind, among humankind, and between humanity and creation.



## **“The Cross and Pentecost: Beyond the Schleiermacher/Barth Divide”**

**Frank Macchia | Vanguard University**

---

Karl Barth’s struggle with the theology of Friedrich Schleiermacher illustrates well the attempt in the West to highlight the atonement so as to grant Christology significance in its own right in counterbalance to pneumatology. Early Pentecostals also attempted in various ways to counterbalance and integrate atonement and Pentecost (“the blood and the Spirit”). A reflection on the classic Schleiermacher/Barth divide will set the stage for a contemporary Pentecostal proposal for integrating the cross and Pentecost in a way that gives both events proper emphasis.



## **“The Challenge of Anatheism: Revisiting God Beyond God”**

“What God returns after the death of God? A God of love rather than sacrifice? Of vulnerability rather than theodicy? A God of kenosis and interreligious dialogue rather than one of triumphal exclusivism? Richard Kearney attempts to address these questions with reference to contemporary readings - literary, theological and philosophical - of the Christian Gospel.”
